THEN CAME SUNDAY

While anyone can take time to answer these questions individually, these questions are best discussed in a group! Not in a group yet? We want you in one! Head over to southeastchristian.org to join a group in person or online, wherever you are - today!

What is your favorite Easter memory? When you think about Easter Sunday, what does this day mean to you? How has the story of Easter changed your story?

In what ways have you experienced “information overload” in your own life? How does it make it difficult for us to make decisions? How does it keep us from real self-reflection? How does it hinder us from a deeper relationship with Jesus?

Read I Corinthians 15:3-8. What does Paul identify as the most important thing? What reasons does he give for us to trust in the reality of the resurrection? What ramifications does the resurrection have for the way we live? What would a life lived with this “one thing” as top priority look like?

Kyle talked about his daughter and how she made the stain on the couch worse by trying to clean it herself. What are some ways we try to “fix” our own sin and shame? How do these things usually make the problem worse? How does Jesus handle our sin and shame?

Read Mark 16:2-7. Why is it significant that the angels singled out Peter in their words? How do you think Peter felt when he heard the news and that he had been mentioned by name? In what ways has your experience been similar to Peter’s?

New life always brings joy and celebration. What’s one practical thing you can do this week to celebrate the new life you have because of Christ? How can you make sure your celebration of Easter extends beyond just the one weekend?
