**WHAT TO PREPARE:** Print a copy of the “Integrity Scenarios” and cut them into strips. Put them in a bag, box, hat, or something similar.

**WHAT YOU DO:**

- Place the “Integrity Scenarios” strips in the bag and explain to everyone that the bag is filled with different situations and a response. Some responses will show integrity, some will not.
- One at a time, let kids draw a slip of paper out of the bag. They get to act out the scenario AND response according to what’s written. (To make it easier, you can allow kids to talk as they act out their scenario.)
- The rest of the group will call out if the response is “Integrity” or “NO integrity.” (Note that the goal isn’t for the group to guess what’s happening in each scenario. The goal is to differentiate between responding with or without integrity.)
- If the response on the slip is “No Integrity,” discuss how someone might respond differently in order to be truthful with your whole life.
- Continue until everyone has had at least one chance to act out a scenario and response.

**WHAT YOU SAY:**

Nice job! Integrity is about so much more than just the words we say. Integrity involves our actions, too! Even when no one else is looking, let’s be truthful with our whole lives. And remember that God can always be trusted! He keeps promises and always does what He says He will do. So when it comes to integrity, we can ALWAYS ask God to help us. It’s really not possible for us to be truthful in our words and actions on our own. So let’s ask God for help!

Pray together as a family.

You find \$10 dollars in the sofa cushion. You check to see if anyone is watching, then stick in your pocket.

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The cashier at the store only charges you for two candy bars, but you have three in your hand. When you realize the mistake, you walk back into the store to pay for the third candy bar.

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You promised you would clean your room. You quickly shove everything under the bed.

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You said you would finish your homework. You sit down and finish it even though you'd rather play outside.

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Your brother left his new iPad® on his bed, and you've used all your screen time for the day. You sneak in his room and download your favorite app onto it.

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You are at a friend's house when they start watching a movie that you know you're not allowed to watch. You suggest a different movie, and everyone agrees to watch it instead.

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Your Mom asks if you've brushed your teeth. You tell her "yes," but you didn't really brush them.

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You're outside playing when your brother accidentally kicks you. All adults are inside and can't see what you're doing. You kick your brother back, hard.

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You have a substitute teacher. You act like you've never been in your classroom before and ignore all the rules.

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You're playing with blocks and pick up your sister's latest creation. A big chunk breaks off, and you can't fix it on your own. You show your sister what happened and tell her you're really sorry.

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Your Mom sets her work laptop on the counter. You accidentally spill an entire cup of water all over it. You clean up all the water without telling your Mom what happened.
